

# We asked. You answered.

We've done the research and read the statistics. It's clear, the coaching profession is evolving and it's our duty to actively reflect the dynamic changes in our landscape and to align with global best practices for professional certification bodies.

More than 1,300 coaches provided input via our survey to identify the key knowledge, skills, abilities and tasks for effective coaching. The evidence we collected represented a diverse range of coaching disciplines, training backgrounds, coaching styles and experience levels.

No other coaching certification body has undertaken this level of research.

Your input ultimately birthed the updated ICF Core Competency model, which we released in late 2019. Using this model, we have not only been able to reflect current best practice in coaching and the skills that coaches are using to make a difference, but we continue to bring life to the core competencies and to the coaching profession itself.



# **ETHICS**

# Record-breaking research.

The 2019 ICF Global Coaching Survey, conducted in collaboration with PricewaterhouseCoopers LLP (PwC), was ICF's most extensive industry research to date. During a seven-month field period (May – December 2019), we achieved a record-breaking number of survey responses from professional coach practitioners and managers/leaders who use coaching skills.

The survey was available in nine languages:

- English
- German
- Japanese
- Mandarin
- Spanish

- French
- Italian
- Korean
- Portuguese

ICF and PwC released the findings from this survey in 2020 as the 2020 ICF Global Coaching Study.

- 22,457 responses from 161 countries and territories
- 46% increase in responses from the 2016 Global Coaching Study.
- 52 countries and territories with 100+ responses

# **INDUSTRY RESEARCH**

ICF also partnered with the Human Capital Institute (HCI) on a signature research study, *Building Strong Coaching Cultures for the Future*. This research was designed as an update to previous ICF/HCI studies, with an emphasis on activities associated with building strong coaching cultures in organizations.

The study included 366 human resources, learning and development, and talent development professionals.

From October 23 – 26, coaches from around the world came together in Prague, Czech Republic, for the second ICF Converge conference and the premier coaching event of 2019.


ICF Converge 2019 featured General Session Keynote presentations from Frans Johansson and Luvvie Ajayi, as well as Group Keynotes from:






